Atlantic County Records Strong Employment Growth

Atlantic County experienced a 5.8% growth in employment from February 2018 to February 2019. The county recorded 130,200 non-agricultural jobs in February 2019, which has historically been a seasonally low period for the economy. Employment will grow by 10,000 to 15,000 jobs during the peak summer months.
